<u>Teacher's Notes Primary Cycle 3</u> <u>Suffix -ing</u>

1. Session warm up

Introduce International Literacy Day using this video.

2. Phonics lesson

Introduce the suffix *-ing*. Suffixes in English are a group of letters that we add to the end of a word. Some examples of suffixes are *-ing* and *-ed*. Sometimes the root word changes when we add a suffix.

For words that end in *e*, we drop the *e* and add *-ing*. **hope** —> **hoping**

What happens with the word *hop*? Hop is pronounced with a short *O*. We double the last consonant to protect the short vowel sound.

hop —> hopping



For one-syllable words, double the last consonant when the word follows the pattern:

consonant + vowel + consonant

For two-syllable words, double the last consonant if the stress is on the last syllable, and last three letters follow the pattern:

consonant + vowel + consonant
